【講評】

例年通り大学受験においては最高峰と言える難易度の問題が出題された。本文、選択肢ともに語彙のレベルが高く、最低でも英検準一級合格に必要とされる英単語は身に付けたうえで臨みたい(例年合格者の中には一部一級合格レベルの単語を覚えて臨んだものも多い)。長い英作文(特にエッセイ)が課される入試では、予想される配点の高さと、完成させなければ採点すらしてもらえないという点から、優先的に作文を解きたい。エッセイを短時間で常に一定以上の水準で完成させるためには、方法論の教授と訓練、そして添削(フィードバック)が必須だといえる。

[WRITING QUESTION]

The passage in section III describes two different attitudes about medical errors: that of admitting the medical errors of one's own making with a full explanation and apology, and that of somehow distracting attention from one's mistakes in order to keep one's face. There is no doubt that the former is the better for patients, although the concealment is widely conducted for the sake of doctors.

Fist of all, the act of nondisclosure might be a catalyst for a future catastrophe such as ever-lasting symptoms on the patient and, in the worst case, the death of them, which situation, of course, is not preferred and, as long as that can be avoided with the doctor honestly disclosing the fact at an early stage, he assumes all the responsibility for it. The life outweighs anything, not only reputation or career. Plus, given the article saying the general attitude toward not taking legal action on the condition that doctors are open to acknowledge their own mistakes, even the career might be intact. Doctors, in the first place, treat the most valuable treasure of all, life. It has to be taken into consideration.
